Reid Residents' Association (RRA) has had another busy year and I would like to thank committee member for their respective contributions over the last 12 months.

We have aimed at fulfilling the Objectives of the association as set down in RRA's constitution:

- 4. (1) To foster an appreciation of the present Reid environment and encourage its preservation, taking account of the interest and welfare of the community.
 - (2) To support and implement agreed action on Reid Community projects and interests.

There is an obvious divide between the Reid Housing Precinct heritage issues and the usual issues relating to all suburbs of Canberra such as street cleaning, lighting, garbage collection, parking in streets and on nature strips, burglaries and neighbour disputes.

Our activities to foster an appreciation of our beautiful environment and implement various actions on behalf of the community are outlined below.

Meetings and correspondence

We have corresponded and met with ACT Government, including MLAs and Ministers on the following issues:

- establishment of parking spaces and/or parking vehicles illegally on nature strips thus damaging the verge
- undertaking house renovations without erecting requisite fencing protection for the verge
- erecting wire fences at the front boundary
- operating a commercial carpark encompassing a whole backyard
- building a residential house and converting it into flats after receiving occupancy approval
- inconsistency of development approvals within the Reid Housing Precinct
- mandatory heritage requirements with Mr Fluffy rebuilds.

Regarding parking issues we have requested consideration by Government of one permit per household licensed to car registration so enable overflow parking on the street at any time.

We have encouraged Government to implement mandated heritage requirements and understand that further Mr Fluffy rebuilds in Reid will not follow the current precedent.

Policy and governance appear to be at very much at odds with each other in these matters. We will continue to emphasise the importance of implementation and enforcement of the Government's own

City Railway Remnant

We congratulate the National Trust's work that has resulted in the City Railway Remnant on the southern side of Amaroo Street being entered into ACT Heritage Register. 12th Open House & Gardens

The National Trust (ACT) in collaboration with RRA and the property owners opened three privately-owned houses and gardens from the 1920s & 30s. The properties, comprised two late 1920s Federal Capital Commission (FCC) houses (a FCC 7 & a FCC 9), and a 1936 Dept. of Interior Type 'O' house. This is always a very popular event and unfortunately people had to be turned away as there is a limit on numbers for safety reasons.

Dinners

We have held two well attended dinners at the Mercure giving residents a chance to catch up and air any concerns they might have.

Reid Tennis Club

We have been very happy to support the activities of the Reid Tennis Club by promoting family events on the RRA website. We look forward to exploring possible shared events and activities.

Burglaries

There does seem to be a spike in the number of burglaries in Reid over the last 18 months. Please report these to the ACT Police and look to see how you can increase the security of your home.

Neighbour disputes

The RRA is concerned that some residents are unaware that their actions are actually reducing the amenity of the suburb and are, in many cases, unlawful. Destruction of nature strips, inadequate protection of street trees during renovation, removal of registered trees, barking dogs, excessively loud noise (parties, air conditioners, chain saws etc.), illegal parking, are all subject to law.
