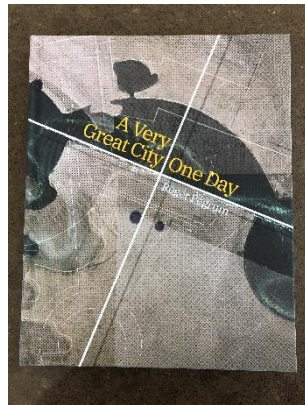




# A VERY GREAT CITY ONE DAY

In his recently published book *A Very Great City One Day* Roger Pegrum raises the challenges that face Canberra's future. Will Northbourne Avenue transform into a grand boulevard full of life? Are we reserving space for a 'genuine and generous city square' with room for 'a sunny city heart'? How are we managing the renewal of established residential suburbs? Building for intensifying weather? What sort of place do we want Canberra to be? Are we looking after our national capital? Roger Pegrum has had a long and productive career in architecture and design with appointments as Chief Architect for the Commonwealth of Australia and associate professor of architecture at the University of Sydney. His books include *The Bush Capital*, *Australian Government Architects* and two volumes of *Details in Australian Architecture*. His own house in Reid was awarded the Canberra Medallion of the ACT Chapter of the RAI in 2006 and is featured *100 Canberra Houses* by Tim Reeves and Alan Roberts.
