REID VOLUNTEERS – We need YOU

Keen to get weeding in the parks, laneways and byways in our lovely suburb?

The Reid Residents' Association has been advised that the best way to do this is through ACT Urban Parks and Places Volunteering at www.cityservices.act.gov.au/public-land/maintenance/volunteering. This enables a community partnership between the local community and the ACT Government and, as a registered volunteer group, a Reid weeders' group would have insurance cover, assistance with equipment and removing prunings etc. Some of the activities that current volunteer groups undertake include:

We can do a lot to improve some of the areas that are infested with: invasive grasses, English Ivy, Vinca and woody weeds such as Cotoneaster and St John's Wort and it can be fun checking on our Gang-gangs, having BBQs and excellent morning teas.

Some areas to start with could be the Reid Railway Reserve parallel with Amaroo Street and the laneways that run north/south in Dirrawan Gardens and Geerilong Gardens between Amaroo and Elimatta streets.

GANG-GANGS in REID

With increasing awareness of the presence of Gang-gang cockatoos in Reid we invited Dr Michael Mulvaney to visit the Reid Railway Reserve site, Amaroo Street. Subsequently, on 9 July, on site Michael was able to provide residents with information about their presence — and the Gang-gangs timed their visit right on cue — and scoped a number of possible nesting holes. Michael has also kindly provided us with the article below.

Nationally the Gang-gang is in trouble having suffered a 69% decline over the last 25 years. In the Canberra area it seems to be holding its own, and we would like to try and work out why this may be so. One reason may be the plentiful supply of tree hollows in the bush surviving in and around the Capital.

We have located 52 Gang-gang nests all within 250 m of the urban edge. Four of these nest records are in planted trees of similar age and species to that of the Reid 'railway line' plantings. One of the nests is in Bass Gardens (Griffith), while another was on the ANU Campus.

So, it is possible that there is a nest within Reid or the Blue-gum plantings along Anzac Parade.

Gang-gangs check out hollows all year but will pick up their looking in August and September and will begin nesting in October, when they become secretive and harder to spot.

If you see a Gang-gang looking into, entering or within a hollow could you please report it with a photo on

Brushtail Possums are the biggest competitors for Gang-gang nest hollows in the Canberra area, and also a predator of eggs and chicks. Gang-gangs won't nest in a tree, even if it has multiple empty hollows, if a possum is in one hollow

The Reid plantings do contain a few suitable hollows but a possum was found in one recently poled, so perhaps it is unlikely they are nesting there, but we can remain hopeful.

They certainly are feeding in the Reid plantings and we know that adults will travel at least 4 km from their nesting hollow when searching for food for their chicks

Favoured food of nesting birds includes gum nuts, green immature wattle pods, green cones of Cypress and Callitris pines and a variety of insects (particularly sawfly larvae).

Blue Gums are favoured comprising a third of the diet of Canberra's Gang-gangs. Thus, mass plantings in Reid and along Anzac Parade are probably of importance for maintaining the breeding pairs known to nest on Mt Ainslie

By planting wattles, Calllitris pines and favoured native berry species like White Cedar (*Melia azerderach*) or Geebungs (*Persoonia spp.*) you can further enhance the local foraging habitat and encourage Gang-gangs to your gardens.
